**RULES FOR POST-PUBLICATION REVIEW OF ANSWERSSCRIPTS OF B.A. /B.SC. /B.COM.
/B.SW. /BBA /BCA UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (C.B.C.S) INTRODUCED FROM
THE SESSION 2019-2020 ONWARDS**

1. General Rules:

- a) There shall be no Post-Publication Review of Practical courses, Oral Examination, and Project Work/Field Work, Compulsory language and Environmental Studies courses, if any.
- b) Post-Publication Review and Post-Publication Scrutiny of the same course(s) in a subject shall not be allowed.
- c) A candidate may apply for Post-Publication Review of her/his answerscript(s) of maximum 2 (two) theoretical courses including Honours and General subjects in the prescribed form and manner and on submission of fees prescribed for the purpose within the date as per notification to be issued by the Office of the Controller of Examinations.
Such applications must be checked and verified by the Colleges concerned in regard to the eligibility of the candidate applying for review. All such applications must be forwarded by the Principal/Teacher-in-Charge of the College concerned.
- d) Incomplete and faulty application is liable to be rejected without assigning reason or without any intimation to the candidate and College concerned.
- e) Under no circumstances, fees for Post-Publication Review once paid, shall be refunded.

- f) Prayer for Post-Publication Review in prescribed manner in respect of any Examination cannot be related to the appearance of the next year's Examination, as the case may be. Candidates applying for the Post-Publication Review shall have to make necessary preparations for the next Examination on the basis of her/his original results accordingly, even though they have applied for the same.

2. Review of answerscripts of candidates of Honours/Programme Courses:

a) For Honours Candidates:

A candidate obtaining 30% of marks and above in aggregate in Honours Subject and 20% of marks and above in Programme / Combination Subjects or Group of Subjects may apply for review in any PART of Examination.

b) For Programme Candidates:

A candidate obtaining 20% and above in Programme /Combination Subjects or Group of Subjects may apply for review in any PART of Examination.

3. Finalisation of Review Results:

- a) Marks awarded in the Post-Publication Review shall be accepted if upto 15% of Full Marks and shall be treated as final marks of the candidate in the course(s) and the result of the candidate concerned will be finalised accordingly.
- b) In exceptional cases (if more than 15% marks of Full Marks is awarded) the matter be referred to the Vice-Chancellor for finalisation.
- c) Any addition or subtraction of marks as declared by the university after Post-Publication Review shall be treated as final and shall be binding on the candidate.
- d) No further application for consideration of Post Publication Review result shall be entertained.

4. SCRUTINY OF ANSWER SCRIPTS :

- a) There shall be no Post-Publication Scrutiny in Practical Papers.
 - b) A candidate may apply for post-publication scrutiny in all theoretical papers irrespective of marks, if s/he so desires.
 - c) Scrutiny and Review of same papers in a subject shall not be allowed
 - d) A candidate applying for Post-Publication Scrutiny of her/his answerscripts shall have to accept her/his marks after Post-Publication: Scrutiny.
 - e) If the result of a candidate of Honours/Programme course of any PART of her/his Examination does not come under the purview of Post-Publication Review, s/he may apply for Post-Publication Scrutiny of her/his one or more answerscripts irrespective of marks obtained.
 - f) "Post-Publication Scrutiny" does not imply re-examination or reassessment of answerscripts but involves verification of answerscripts and records to ascertain whether marks have been assigned to each of the required number of answers made by an examinee as per instruction printed on the question paper, totalling of marks awarded by the Examiners on the scripts/marks-slips as the case may be, has correctly been done, and posting of marks has been made correctly from the answerscripts to the Marks-slips, Mark-slips to Tabulation Sheets, and Tabulation Sheets to individual Marksheets.
5. If any dispute arises as to the interpretation, intention or application of any of the provisions of these Regulations or any matter not covered by these Regulations, the decision of the Executive Council in this regard shall be final and binding.
